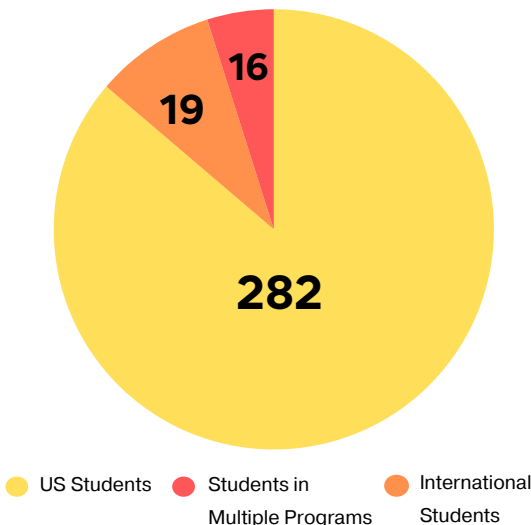


Mission Statement

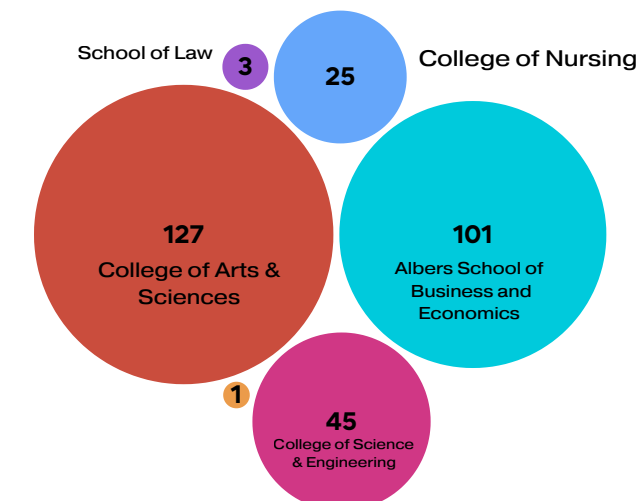

317 Students Went Abroad This Academic Year!



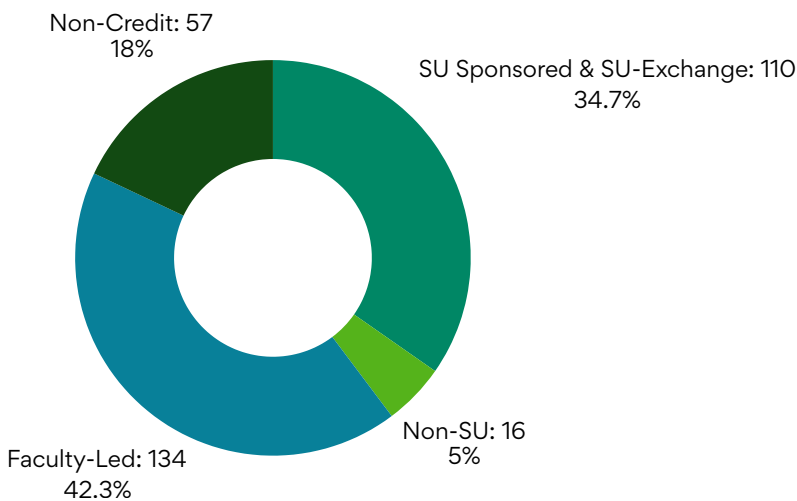
Participation by Program Type



42% of students that went abroad during the academic year 2023-2024 were from the College of Arts & Sciences.

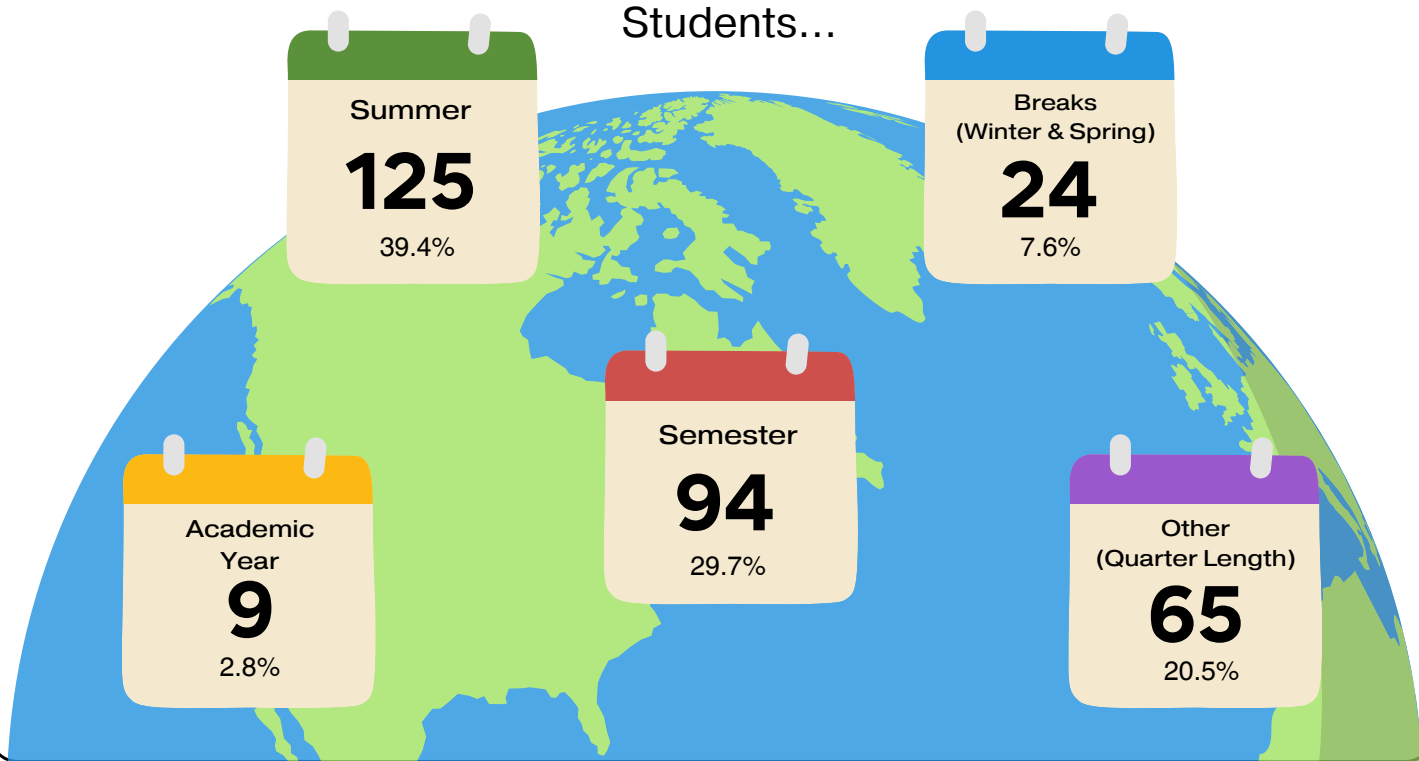
Participation by College

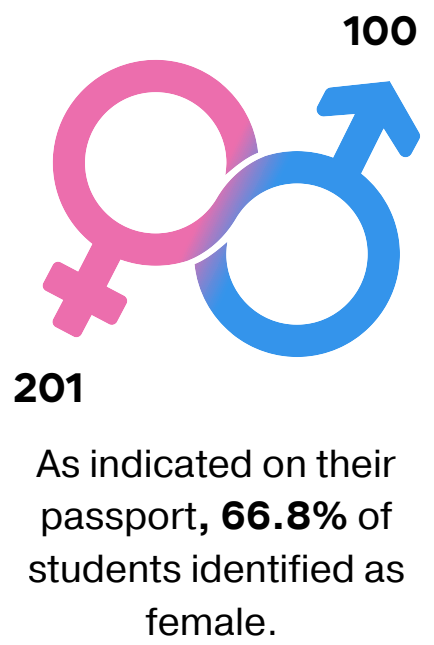
Academic Standing



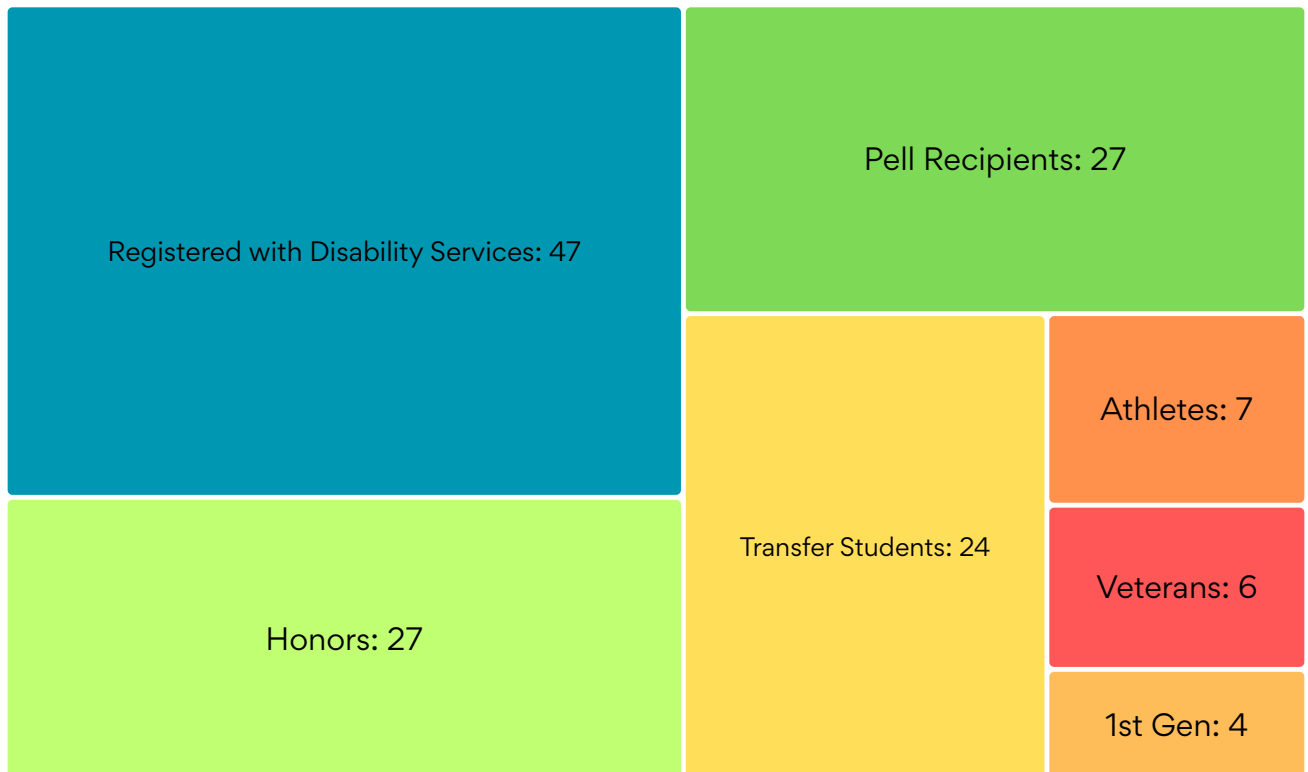
