Satisfactory Academic Progress (SAP) Satisfactory Academic Progress (SAP) is a condition for eligibility for financial aid. It consists of both quantitative and qualitative data: 1. Pace - complete at least 67% of all credits attempted


2. **Maximum Timeframe** - 150% of the published number of credits required to earn the student's degree

3. Grade Point Average 2.0 in major and minor (after 15 credits completed) for Undergraduates and 3.0 for Graduates

- Students are reviewed at the end of each Spring quarter and those who have not maintained SAP are notified via their SU email that their
- financial aid has been suspended, and they have the right to appeal. SFS counselors will work with students to determine the best course of action based on their circumstances. The appeal process can take a few weeks to complete, so it is important to respond right away.

Federal Student Aid Direct Subsidized Loans and Direct Unsubsidized Loans are federal student loans offered by the U.S. Department of Education (ED) to help

eligible students cover the cost of higher education at a four-year college

or university. Graduate students are only eligible for Direct Unsubsidized

Loans. Seattle U awards these loans in the "accepted" status-which


