

## ADVANCED LEVEL (A-LEVEL) EXAM CREDIT

Students seeking Seattle University credit by taking Advanced Level exams as part of their high school curriculum or through the Cambridge AICE Diploma Program should request that the official examination results be sent to Seattle University.

Granted for work completed in secondary school, the Seattle University credits awarded for A-Level examinations are not considered to be transfer credits and, therefore, the transfer credit waivers and Core transfer policy do not apply. However, A-Level credits that fall within the maximum chronological transfer credit restrictions. The maximum number of credits granted for A-Level examinations is 45.

A-Level examination results will be evaluated according to the policies outlined below. Once an evaluation is completed, the student's record is updated to reflect the credits accepted and may be viewed on SU Online via the Program Evaluation.

The following departments grant credits for A-Level exams. Examination results relating to other departments will be sent to the appropriate chairperson and action will be determined on an individual basis.

A maximum of 45 credits can be earned between AP, IB, CLEP, and A-level.
