## Important Major Information

- Credits in Major: 80
- Minimum Major GPA: 2.00 (some scholarships may require higher)
- College of Arts and Sciences Requirements: 20 credits
  - HIST 1200, 1210 or 2310
  - Modern Language 1150, 1250, 1350 or demonstrated proficiency
- Students begin this program as Design Candidates. Admission to the advanced major requires approval and review by faculty of portfolio and written components after completion of ART 1000, 1200, ARTD 2700, 2710, and 2720.
- Major Electives: 15 credits. Choose from ART, ARTD, or ARTH electives at the 3000-4000 level. May include ARTL 1000 to 4000, ARTH 2130, MUSC/THTR 2650 and/or PHOT 2650.
- Art and art history transfer credits are subject to review which may include portfolio review, audition, exam and/or interview.
