

ADVANCED PLACEMENT EXAMINATIONS OF THE COLLEGE ENTRANCE EXAMINATION BOARD (AP)

Advanced placement in courses may be obtained either through approved departmental examinations or by the Advanced Placement Examinations of the College Entrance Examination Board, (CEEB). Credit for AP, IB, CLEP, and/or A-level may not exceed 45 total credits.

Advanced Placement Examinations of the College Entrance Examination Board

Students seeking credit by taking the AP examination through CEEB request that official examination results be sent to the Office of Undergraduate Admissions.

Seattle University credit awarded for AP examinations are not considered to be transfer credits and, therefore, the University Core Curriculum policy 2012-01 regarding transfer credits does not apply. AP credits do fall within the maximum lower division transfer credit restrictions.

AP examination results will be evaluated according to the criteria outlined below. Once an evaluation is completed, the student's record is updated to reflect the credits accepted and may be viewed on MySeattleU, Student Planning area, in the section titled *Program Evaluation*.

The following departments grant credit for AP exams. Examination results relating to other departments will be sent to the appropriate chairperson and action will be determined on an individual basis.

<u>ART HISTORY</u>	Score 3 or higher	5 credits for art elective; Art majors should see department chair to determine course equivalency.
<u>ART GENERAL</u>	Score 3 or higher	5 credits for art elective; Art majors should see department chair to determine course equivalency.
<u>ART DRAWING</u>	Score 3 or higher	5 credits for ART 1200; fulfills UCOR 1300 requirement.
<u>ART 3D DESIGN</u>	Score 3 or higher	5 credits for art elective, fulfills UCOR 1300 requirement. Art majors should see department chair to determine course equivalency.
<u>ART 2D DESIGN</u>	Score 3 or higher	5 credits for ART 1000; fulfills UCOR 1300 requirement.

<u>BIOLOGY</u>	Score 4 or higher	5 credits for BIOL 1010. A student who earns a 5 on the exam may choose to contact the Biology Department to take a Placement Exam to try to earn credit in the year-long Introductory Biology series (instead of BIOL 1010).
<u>CHEMISTRY</u>	Score 4 or higher	5 credits for CHEM 1500/1501. Score 5, see department to take a challenge exam for CHEM 1510 credit.
<u>COMPUTER SCIENCE</u> A or AB Exam	Score 4 or higher	5 credits for CPSC 1420.
<u>COMPUTER SCIENCE PRINCIPLES</u>	Score 4 or higher	5 credits for CPSC 1100.
<u>ECONOMICS</u> Macro Micro	Score 4 or higher Score 4 or higher	5 credits for ECON 2130. 5 credits for ECON 2110.
<u>ENGLISH</u>	A maximum of 10 credits will be granted for English even if two exams are completed.	
Lit & Comp Lang & Comp	Score 4 or higher Score 4 or higher	5 credits for UCOR 1100. 5 credits for UCOR 1100, or general elective.
<u>ENVIRONMENTAL SCIENCE</u>	Score 3 Score 4 or higher	5 elective credits. 5 credits for EVST 1600.
<u>HISTORY</u> U.S. European	Score 4 or higher Score 4 or higher	5 credits for HIST 2310; fulfills A&S College requirement for history. 5 credits for HIST 1200. A/S students should then take HIST 2310 rather than HIST 1210 to fulfill college requirement.
<u>WORLD HISTORY</u> Modern	Score 4 or higher	5 credits for HIST 1210; satisfies A&S College requirement for history.
<u>HUMAN GEOGRAPHY</u>	Score 3 or higher Score 4 or higher	5 credits for a Sociology elective. May count towards INST 2100.
<u>LANGUAGE AND CULTURES</u> Chinese	Score 3 or higher	Score 3, 5 credits for language at the 1150 level. Score 4-5, an additional 5 credits for the 1250 level.*

French	Score 3 or higher	Score 3, 5 credits for language at the 1150 level. Score 4-5, an additional 5 credits for the 1250 level. *
German	Score 3 or higher	Score 3, 5 elective credits. Score 4-5, an additional 5 elective credits. Must complete through 1350 level to fulfill A/S language requirement.
Italian	Score 3 or higher	Score 3, 5 elective credits. Score 4-5, an additional 5 elective credits. Must complete through 1350 level to fulfill A/S language requirement.
Japanese	Score 3 or higher	Score 3, 5 credits for language at the 1150 level. Score 4-5, an additional 5 credits for the 1250 level.*
Latin	Score 3 or higher	Score 3, 5 elective credits. Score 4-5, an additional 5 elective credits.
Spanish	Score 3 or higher	Score 3, 5 credits for language at the 1150 level. Score 4-5, an additional 5 credits for the 1250 level.*
Modern Language (Literature)	Score 3 or higher	5 general elective credits.*

*Does not satisfy upper division literature requirement for modern language majors or minors.

Physics 1 Exam	Score 4 or higher	5 credits for PHYS 1050 & 1051.
Physics 2 Exam	Score 4 or higher	10 credits for PHYS 1060 & 1061 and 1070 & 1071. Not applicable for BS in Biochemistry, BS in Chemistry, or BS in Computer Science/general option or math specialization, or for engineering or physics majors.

C Exam: Students may take either one or both parts of the “C” exam. Physics and Engineering majors and those seeking a BS in Biochemistry, BS in Chemistry, or a BS in Computer Science/general option or math specialization, should take the C exam rather than the Physics 1 and 2 exams.

Physics C: Electricity and Magnetism	Score 4 or higher	5 credits for PHYS 1220 & 1221.
