<b>SU Scholarships &amp; Grants</b>	Students participating in this program for Spring Semester will receive <b>1 quarter of SU aid instead of 2</b> (one quarter's worth of SU aid per semester abroad). To calculate the amount applied to Spring Semester abroad, divide the annual SU Aid award by 3; to calculate the amount applied to Winter & Spring Quarters on SU campus, multiply the annual SU Aid award by 2/3.		
<b>Additional Aid</b>	This includes any extra financial assistance students may receive during the academic year on campus or through education abroad scholarships. Since the portability of additional aid for education abroad varies by aid type and program, students should consult Student Financial Services for specific details.
