




## OUR CLASSROOMS

We accept the Common Application for first-year applicants or the Seattle University Transfer Application for transfer applicants.


REVIEW APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS AND SUBMIT MATERIALS

Request transcripts and recommendations and write essays per your program application requirements. Submitting test scores is optional. Pay the \$60 fee or request a waiver.

REVIEW AND SUBMIT

Double-check your application for completeness, submit it by the deadline and monitor your status through the Redhawk Applicant Portal, where you may see requests for additional documentation.
