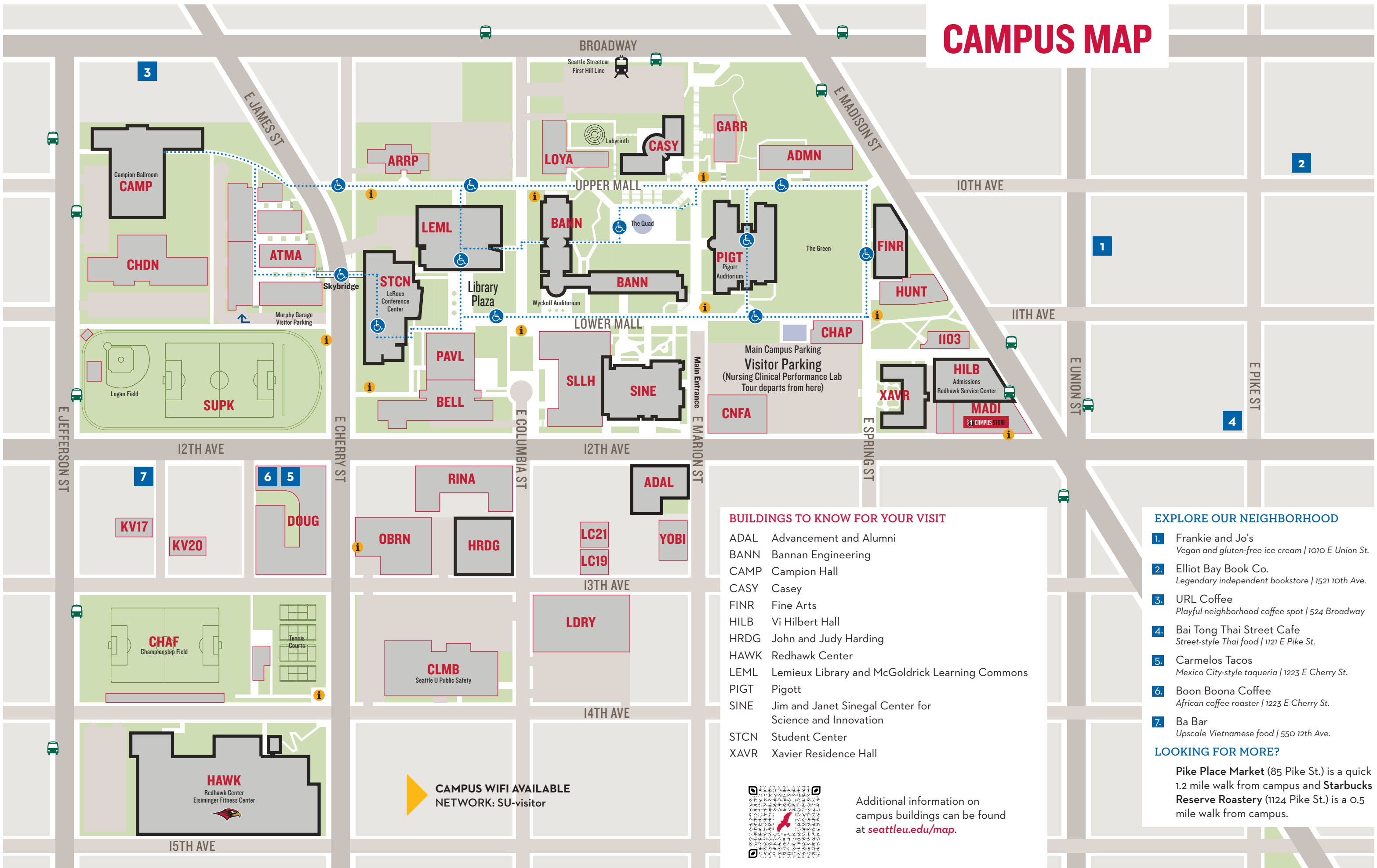
Residence Hall Viewing (1-3 p.m.) **Bellarmino & Xavier Hall (BELL, XAVR)**

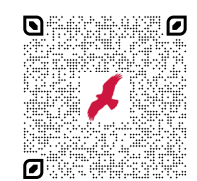

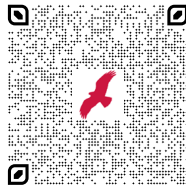

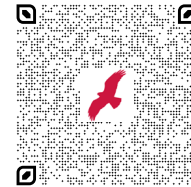
