




BY COLLEGE

57.8% of students that went abroad during the academic year 2019-2020 were from the College of Arts & Sciences.




The chart above includes double majors in different colleges.

BY GENDER



ADDITIONAL STUDENT INFORMATION

- 75% of Seattle University students participating in study abroad during 2019-2020 were First Time in College students, and 11% were Transfer.
- 19 of the 384 students were First Generation, the first in their family to attend college.
- 7 of the 384 students were in the Running Start program.
- Despite a rigorous sports schedule, 15 of the 384 students were Athletes.
- 27 of the 384 students were in the University Honors program.
